

Service Notes

The **paraments** are **white** during the Christmas season (ending on Epiphany) and help invite the church to reflect on the incarnation (embodiment) of God as a human being: “And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory” (John 1:14). In Christ, God enters human history and identifies fully with the human condition. The traditional color of this season is white, symbolizing joy in the light of God. *This information is from ucc.org.*
